Mistake #5 Using "不 (bù)" to negate the verb "有 (yǒu)-to have"

Before we continue, remember this, you should NEVER EVER say "不有 (bù yǒu)".

The verb "to have-有 (yǒu)" is verb with a VIP status. It deserves its own very special negation word which is "没 (méi)". To say "not have", you should say "没有 (méi yǒu)". You should never say "不有 (bù yǒu)". There is no such a thing!

Examples
